Diagnostic: Pretest

Formative: How are students doing during the unit?

• Summative: Evaluate the learning at the end of a unit

Benchmark:

- Interim assessment used to drive future instruction
- Given to large populations
- Measured against standards
- Predictor to performance on standardized assessments
- Provides data quickly




