



# Special Education Bill S3434 What Families Should Know for the '21-'22 School Year

#### S3434/A5366



- Signed by Governor Murphy on June 16th, 2021
- Extends eligibility for special education, related services, and transition services to certain students who turned 21 during the 2020-2021 school year.
- Also extends services to certain students who turn 21 during the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school years.
- If your child missed out on services because of the pandemic and will turn 21 this year or next year, they may be eligible under this law.



# Are all Students who Turned 21 Eligible for Additional Services?

Not all students who receive special education and related services will be considered eligible under S3434. The IEP team must agree that the student requires additional services, including special education, related therapy/services and transition services.

Parents are active members of the IEP team and have the right to participate in the decision-making process and any meetings related to additional services for the student.





#### What are the Additional Services?

Additional or Compensatory Services can be offered by the school district in different ways including, but not limited to:

- An additional year in the school district
- Make up sessions for hours missed
- Services provided by agencies other than the school
- Therapy sessions for new challenges

Tip: Be creative and flexible to find options that will benefit the student. The IEP can help you recognize what may be needed.



# **Steps to Getting Additional Services Under S3434**

- Request an IEP Meeting and state that you think your child needs additional services because of the COVID pandemic.
- Be prepared to show why you believe your child needs the additional services.

#### Gather any documents that support your position.

- Develop a list of potential solutions that you would like the district to consider.
- If graduation is approaching, let the IEP team know that your child will not be accepting a diploma.
- Remind the district that services associated with this law are federally funded, and the school will be reimbursed.

The Arc of New Jersey Family Institute is happy to help families prepare for IEP meetings, and if needed, attend as non-attorney advocates.



# How Can I Show that My Child Needs Additional Services?

Implementing virtual services may not have met IEP requirements or the district's obligation to provide a free and appropriate public education (FAPE). You can take the following steps to show that your child needs additional services:

#### Document any services your child did not receive:

Note the number of hours/sessions that were missed

# Gather any pertinent documents from the school or your child's doctors

Evaluations, progress reports, class recordings

#### Describe if your child experienced any of the following:

- New or pre-existing mental health challenges
- Increased anxiety or behavioral challenges
- Regression in learning or other skills





# Districts Might Disagree With You

If your child's IEP team members reject your request for additional services, you can still go through the usual dispute resolution process.

#### **Request mediation**

- A neutral individual will assist in creating solutions that both parties can agree on.
- Mediation is voluntary, so the district and parents both need to agree to participate.

#### File for due process

- More formal resolution, similar to a court proceeding.
- A hearing officer will act as a judge.
- Attorneys are involved

Filing for mediation or due process will invoke stay-put, keeping the student in their current placement until the dispute is resolved.
